Common Name/Scientific name

Lewin's Honeyeater/ Meliphaga lewinii



Description: A small to medium sized honeyeater about 200mm, coloured greenish grey with creamy ywhite-yellow corners of the mouth and large, yellowish crescent-shaped ear patches, black bill and blue-grey eyes. Similar appearance in both sexes and young.

Behaviour in the gardens: Birds are normally seen alone, but may form loose groups of four-six birds.

Feeding: Mostly feed on fruits, favouring berries and small fruits, also nectar and insects. They mostly feed in the upper parts of trees.

Nesting: The nest is a large cup of vegetation and other materials, bound together with spider web and lined with soft material. The eggs are oval in shape.

Where seen in the gardens: Mainly in wetter forest areas along creeks, but does wander out into more open forest areas in search of food.
